

**PROCEDURES FOR APPLYING
NEW YORK STATE MEDICAL INFORMATION SERVICES PROGRAM (MISP)
FUNDING FOR INTERLIBRARY LOAN**

New York State provides funds to improve access to health information to benefit the residents of New York State. The **Medical Information Service Program (MISP)** subsidizes the document delivery charges for interlibrary loan of medical information by the resource libraries of the National Network of Libraries of Medicine (NN/LM). The program is administered regionally by each of the nine Reference and Research Library Resources Systems of New York.

When a patron requests medical or health care information resources that are not available locally, they may be borrowed from participating libraries in the National Network of Libraries of Medicine. Any lending fees assessed by NN/LM libraries can be covered by MISP. ILL requests may be placed in several ways, as explained below. **No matter which way you choose, the books and articles are provided free-of-charge through the New York State Medical information Services Program (MISP) funding.**

SENYLRC applies the MISP funds in three ways:

- pays the NN/LM lending library directly
- deposits funds in the borrowing library's **Electronic Funds Transfer System (EFTS)** account
- reimburses the borrowing library directly if it does not have an EFTS account. Libraries should submit requests for reimbursement to SENYLRC using the form at the following URL: <http://www.senylrc.org/services/resource sharing/mispreinbursement.pdf>.

Methods for placing medical ILL requests:

- **Refer requests to SENYLRC:** The Southeastern NY Library Resources Council (SENYLRC) places requests on behalf of libraries in the region via the DOCLINE® interlibrary loan system. Periodical articles can be sent directly to the patron if a patron email address is supplied. Use the ILL referral form found on the SENYLRC website. <http://www.senylrc.org/services/resource sharing/request.htm>.
- **Libraries participating in OCLC WorldCat Resource Sharing™ or OCLC WorldCat Resource Sharing™ with ILLiad™ Resource Sharing Management Software** may place requests to NN/LM resource libraries that are OCLC participants. Middle Atlantic Region resource libraries participating in OCLC are listed on pages 3 – 4. Borrowing libraries can set up custom holdings to include these resource libraries.
- **DOCLINE®** is the National Library of Medicine's automated interlibrary loan (ILL) request routing and referral system. Some academic and special libraries and most of the hospital libraries in the SENYLRC region are DOCLINE participants, allowing them to place requests directly to NN/LM libraries. DOCLINE libraries may also participate in EFTS.
- **Sign up for Loansome Doc®** through SENYLRC if you order specialized medical or clinical articles on a regular basis but are not authorized to participate in DOCLINE®. Loansome Doc® enables PubMed® and NLM Gateway users to order documents from

citations found in MEDLINE®. (Note to RIC: A link to Loansome Doc information will go here). Such requests are referred to a DOCLINE participant, who then places the request to an NN/LM library.

- **Refer requests to your public or school library system ILL department:** School and public libraries may refer medical requests to their library system interlibrary loan department for placement via OCLC or referral to SENYLRC.
