Historic Huguenot Street

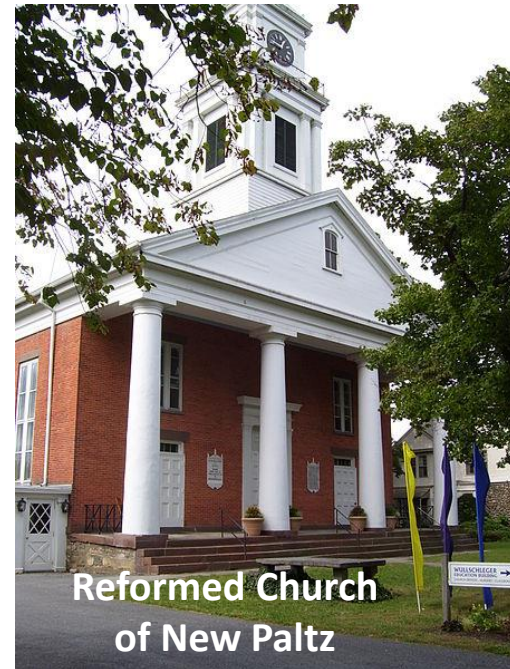







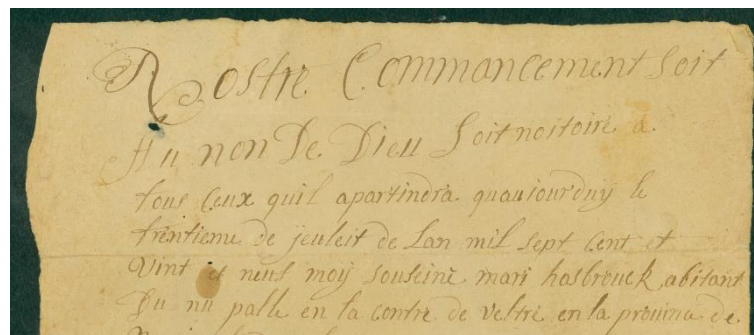
