

The term Arab American refers to anyone living in the United States with ancestry in any of the 22 Arab countries. Arab Americans began immigrating to the United States in large numbers in the 1880s, mainly due to economic factors. Today, Arab immigration is still driven by economic factors, but also war and political upheaval. The total population of Arab Americans is between 2 and 3.6 million.



Tips for Searching Keyword Search The Keyword Search bar above allows you to perform a general search across multiple fields for any catalog records online. Keyword searches use OR as the default connector between words (e.g. a search for Hanley Ranch will return records associated with Hanley OR Ranch). If you want to find records where both keywords are found, type in AND between the two words. To search for a specific phrase,
	be sure to put the phrase within quotes (e.g. "Rocky Pine Ranch"). You can also use the asterisk (") as a wildcard (e.g. a search for histor" would come up with records containing history, histories, historical, etc.). Searches are not case sensitive. Advanced Search The <u>Advanced Search</u> button on the left can help you be more specific with your search. You can search for a word or phrase within a particular search category or use multiple categories to further narrow down your search results. For example, searching White in the People field will bring up any records associated with a member of the White family, without having to sift through black & white photographs. You can also search People and Creator records through Advanced Search. Phrase searching with quotes and use of



The title reflects my quest of reclaiming gender justice and feminine power. Growing up in Saudi Arabia I witnessed firsthand women's oppression, homophobia and strict gender binary. But I also relished in rich artistic traditions that have fresh primal flavors. I use the latter to fight against the former. Eve. Adam, a cat. Satan, an Uroboros, Tree of Life, and God are depicted here for the viewer's own interpretation. The fire halos, border decoration and, background geometric designs are elements of Islamic art. The image addresses the border between genderless Satan who is longingly looking to the Garden of Eden and Eve and Adam who are occupying it. The Uroboros of continuous birth and death makes that border. Satan became evil and was expelled outside borders. Another bordered realm is God who is larger than life but cornered between the Tree of Life, the border of the image and the Uroboros." Artist Hend Al-Mansour







Rosemary Hakim Collection


