As physical locations closed this year, we saw a 60% increase of use in accessing the online holdings of our members.



2,679 EVENT ATTENDEES

Through comprehensive professional development, events, and webinars, we foster a culture of learning. Access to online events allowed us to serve a record number of people this year.











Here are three examples of ways Southeastern provided opportunities for members to connect during a difficult year:

- In the first weeks of the pandemic, we hosted online meetings for members to discuss how they were providing remote services and coping with the tumult.
- Our innovative Ask-the-Lawyer service provided answers to questions about the state's rapidly changing pandemic policies.
- We hosted forums for library workers to process issues of equity, diversity, and inclusion.

I'm proud to share data and details about our accomplishments this year. The staff and Board of Trustees deserve credit for staying focused on delivery of our core services as well as agile responses to changing situations.
