# The Executive Director & Board President

In 2024, Southeastern reaffirmed its commitment to innovation and inclusivity through collaborations with our members. These efforts have strengthened the sharing and preservation of library resources, enhanced professional expertise, and ultimately benefited our patrons.

**Financial Stability**: Southeastern achieved a significant financial milestone by paying off the mortgage on its property at 21 South Elting Corners Road. We also strategically managed reserve funds by investing in high-yield certificates of deposit, ensuring sustainable financial growth.

**Membership Growth**: We are pleased to welcome two new members to our community: the Rhinebeck Historical Society and the Ulster County Archives.

**Commitment to Inter-library Loan**: Libraries in the Southeastern region, represented by public library systems, school library systems, and Southeastern, reaffirmed their commitment to interlibrary loan by passing a code that governs all inter-system borrowing in the Southeastern region.

**Advancing Digital Preservation**: Southeastern is dedicated to supporting member organizations in preserving their essential digital content for future generations. We launched the Digital Preservation Special Interest Group (SIG), which fosters conversations about these complex preservation challenges. Additionally, our Digital Dark Archive (DDA) continued to expand, offering a low-cost, secure storage solution for members' digital resources.

**Enhancing Finding Aids**: In 2024, EmpireADC underwent a significant upgrade that improved indexing efficiency and the harvesting of finding aids. In addition, Southeastern collaborated with SUNY Albany on an Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) grant—Building Archival Digital Discovery and Access Systems with Arclight—which will allow ArcLight to support discovery and access to digital materials, metadata, and full-text content. Digital objects would then be presented within traditional archival descriptions.

**Networking and Learning Opportunities**: Southeastern continued to host in-person and virtual events, fostering professional growth and collaboration. Notable events included the 9th Annual SENYCon, a fall poster and donut session, and the 57th Annual Membership Meeting. In addition to these core in-person events, we hosted numerous online SIGs and webinars on topics relevant to you, including the ESLN Academic Library Leadership Series: Conversations with Experienced Leaders.

**Contributions to Digital Equity**: Through the Digital Navigators of the Hudson Valley, Southeastern continued to provide training and support to library workers who assist patrons with affordable broadband, devices, and technology literacy. Currently, 54 libraries and organizations participate in this service. Additionally, Southeastern secured a Digital Equity Technical Assistance grant from New York State's ConnectALL Office to analyze the program's impact and improve digital access in our communities.

In 2024, the staff continued to deliver core services and adapt programs and services to changing situations. We are pleased to share a snapshot of Southeastern's activities and finances. As we reflect on these activities, we extend our gratitude for the dedicated efforts of trustees, staff, committees, and member organizations.

# Programs & services 2024 In review



**Advocacy** work is ongoing as we represent our membership to local elected officials.

**Ask-the-Lawyer Service** for members to request information on intellectual property, digital rights management, contracts, and other issues that impact library operations.

**Coordinated Collection Development Aid** \$100,728 distributed to 13 academic libraries.

**DOCLINE** was used to fill 271 requests on behalf of members.

**Digital Navigators of the Hudson Valley** comprises 79 trained individuals who provided tech help to 553 individuals.

**Digitization** services helped to put 84,365 of our members' items online.

Empire Library Delivery 14 libraries participated in the state-wide delivery system.

**Hospital Library Services Program** members received \$68,528 in grants and discounts on electronic books and journals.

HRVH Historical Newspapers 74 titles, with 1.3 million visits and 43 million page views.

**Medical Information Services Program** \$1,425 in grants to support medical information requests from member libraries.

**New York Heritage** 307 collections from 75 members, and 1.6 million page views of our members' NYH collections.

**OCLC WorldShare** 51 requests placed on behalf of members.

Online Exhibits 32 digitized, curated exhibits.

Professional Development 667 people attended at least one of our 42 events.

**SouthEastern Access to Libraries (SEAL)** provided inter-library loan services for 181 libraries; 1,990 overall requests placed, with 1,474 requests filled.

**Special Interest Groups** 15 meetings from 7 groups that meet regularly.

**Special Library Catalog** there were 10,608 online visits of 53,712 holdings for 6 special and hospital libraries.

**Tech-Talk** 360 individuals from member organizations received the weekly email.

Visiting Information professionals To provide Adequate Library Staffing (VITAL

**Staffing)** 4 hospitals enrolled, providing professional librarian services to hospital staff.
