Advocacy Day 2024

Fund – Protect – Empower

New York Library Association (NYLA) Library Advocacy Day brings together library advocates from across New York State to converge on Albany to voice their support for funding and policies that benefit libraries. During the day, we will meet with NYS Assembly members and Senators for 30-minute meetings to share the importance of libraries. Join us for meetings with your NYS representatives to make the case that libraries should receive funding increases and support to meet the needs of our communities.

Computers in Libraries Discount

Registration is now open for [Computers in Libraries 2024](#), held at the Hyatt Regency Crystal City in Arlington, VA. If you are receiving this email, you are eligible for a discount by using the code: 24SEN. Or, you can [follow the link here](#) and the code with discounts will be embedded.

With the code, the Gold Pass will be available for the discount rate of \$679 (the regular rate is \$929). The Full 3-Day Pass will be \$399 (regular rate is \$639). In addition, a discounted price of \$629 (regularly \$779) on the Library Leaders Summit (includes all three days of CIL), is also available.

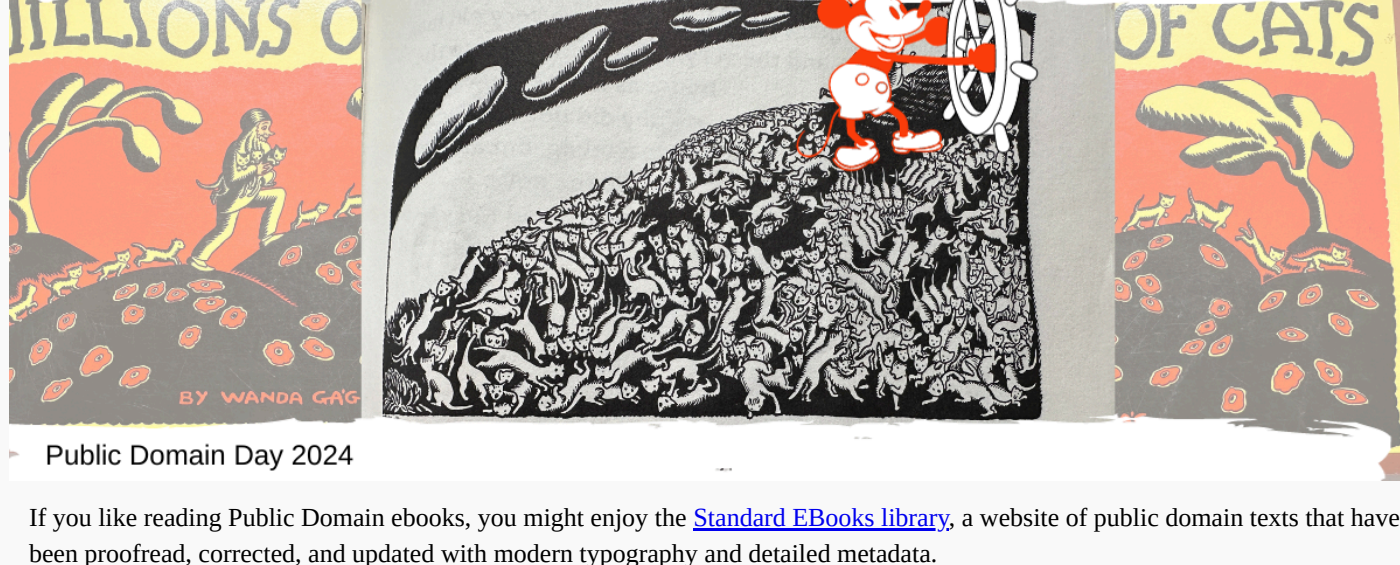

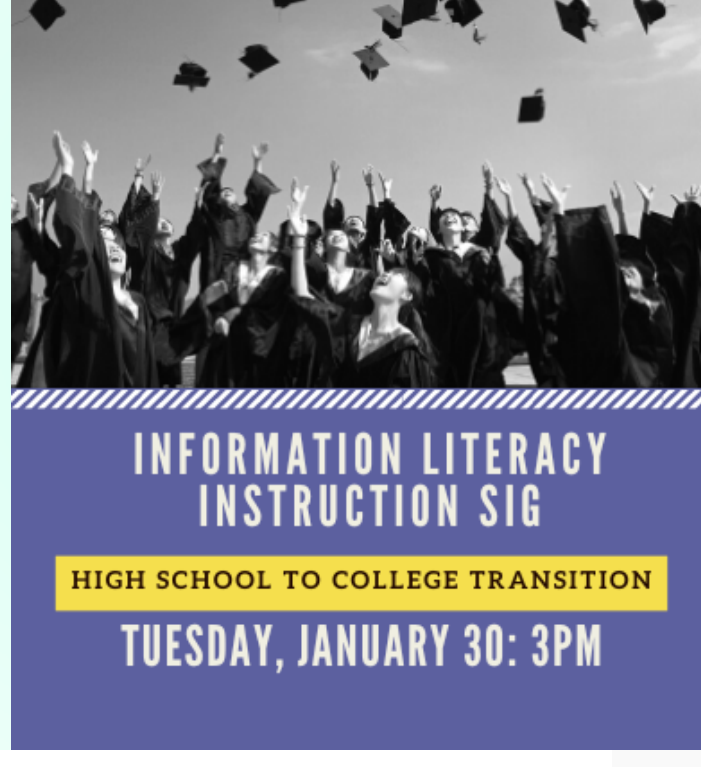

In this webinar, we'll discuss inclusive metadata: what it is, why it's important, and how it can reflect your institution's goals for diversity, equity, and inclusion. We'll discuss the historical biases that have influenced descriptive practices, and explore best practices to audit, research, and improve your terminology to better reflect the identities and values of the people who use your collections and those represented within them. In the process we'll look at a few real world examples to help you move toward creating more inclusive and care-based metadata.

This group is for academic and secondary school librarians to be in conversation with each other.

Do you have a classroom/library activity that you would like to implement or redesign? This month, we will have a couple of instruction activities addressing the "big ideas" ready to workshop in groups. We will ask participants if they would like to share their projects.
