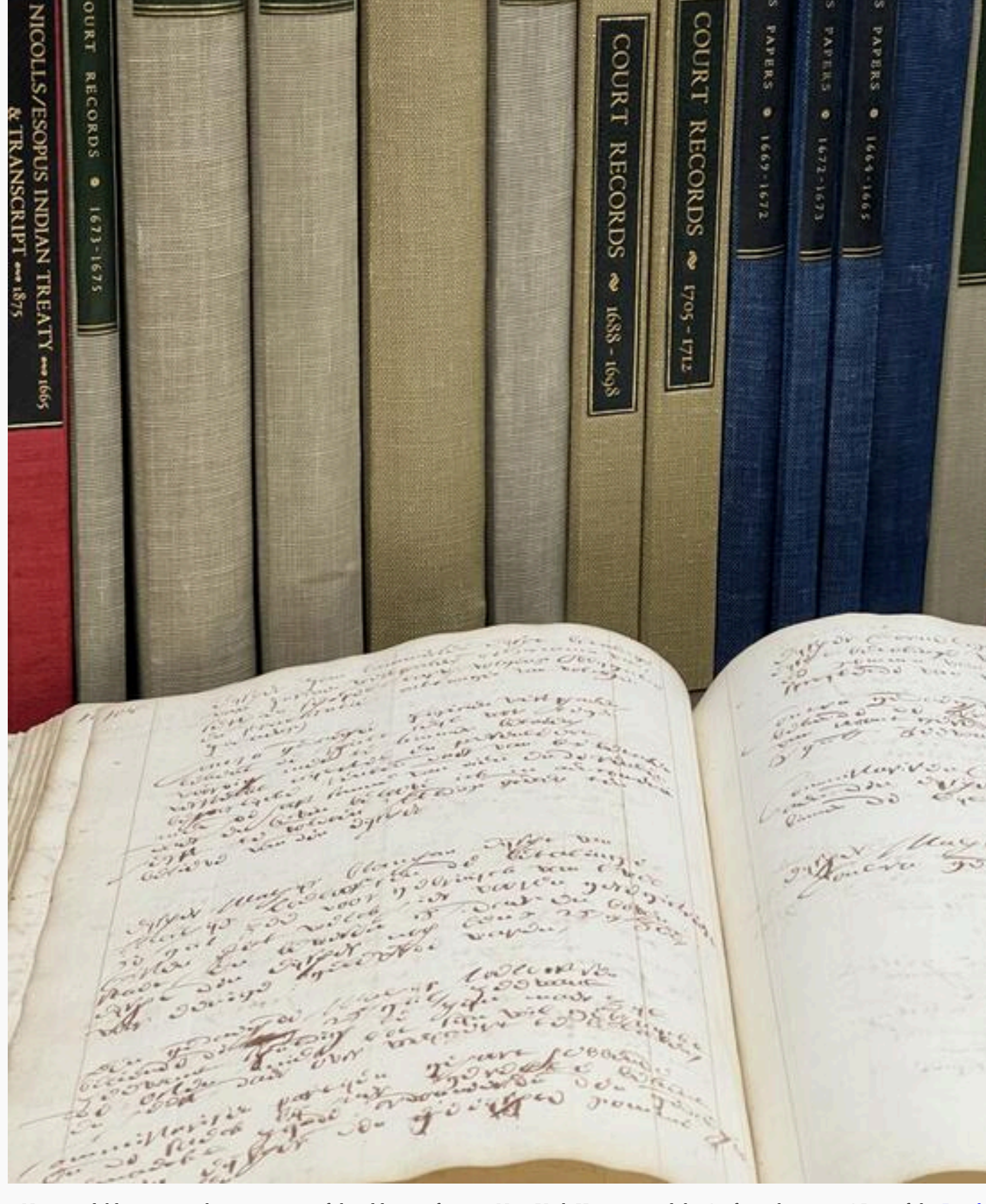

New At New York Heritage



Now available on our website are some of the oldest artifacts on New York Heritage, and they're from this region! Part of the [Dutch Records of Kingston](#) (1658-1683), these holdings are the earliest written records of the community at Kingston. This is a fantastic collection for the serious researcher.

Included in the collection are a finding aid spreadsheet and a three-volume set of translations.

Ask the Lawyer

The council retains an attorney to offer Southeastern and its members timely input on human resources, intellectual property, digital rights management, vendor contracts, First Amendment, civil rights, employment law, and other legal issues that can impact library operations.

Digital Navigators in the News

In June, Digital Navigators of the Hudson Valley's program was highlighted on the National Digital Inclusion Alliance blog. The post was titled [In Hudson Valley, Scaling a Digital Navigator Model with a Regional Approach Is Key to Success](#).

From the article:

More than 1,000 residents have been helped by digital navigators in the region, often teaching tech skills essential to daily tasks. But the stories are powerful.

- One patron learned how to email attachments for the first time—essential for keeping up with housing paperwork.
- One stroke survivor worked with a navigator to relearn computer basics, later sharing, "I'm just so satisfied to be a part of the digital community again."
- A shelter resident learned how to upload documents and send emails. He enrolled in college and started classes that fall.
- A woman wanted to share photos of baby birds with her daughter in England. A digital navigator helped her attach and send the images—something she never thought she'd do on her own.

Congratulations to all our hard-working Digital Navigators and partner systems! We are currently wrapping up our spring cohort and will announce a new round of training for the upcoming year. Watch this space if you're interested in getting involved.
