Candid Foundation Directory

Beginning on July 1, 2025, Governing and HRVH member organizations can access the [Candid Foundation Directory](#), an online database that connects nonprofits with funding opportunities. Recognizing that nonprofit cultural organizations are facing fiscal uncertainty and potentially losing access to longstanding federal grant programs, the Empire State Library Network has negotiated remote access to the Foundation Directory. This best-in-class research tool helps nonprofits identify and connect with over 240,000 U.S. grant makers. **Each dues-paying member of Southeastern is eligible for a user login.**

While some public libraries offer public access to this resource, for your convenience, this partnership will provide direct access to the Foundation Directory for staff at Southeastern members. We hope to open onsite access for staff using your IP addresses; if you have an IP address that can only be accessed by staff and not the public, include it in the form below, and we will try to negotiate that for you. Otherwise, we will provide you with a username and password.

Note: This tool is licensed only for library staff use and is not intended for library users or the general public.

Ask the Lawyer

The council retains an attorney to offer Southeastern and its members timely input on human resources, intellectual property, digital rights management, vendor contracts, First Amendment, civil rights, employment law, and other legal issues that can impact library operations.

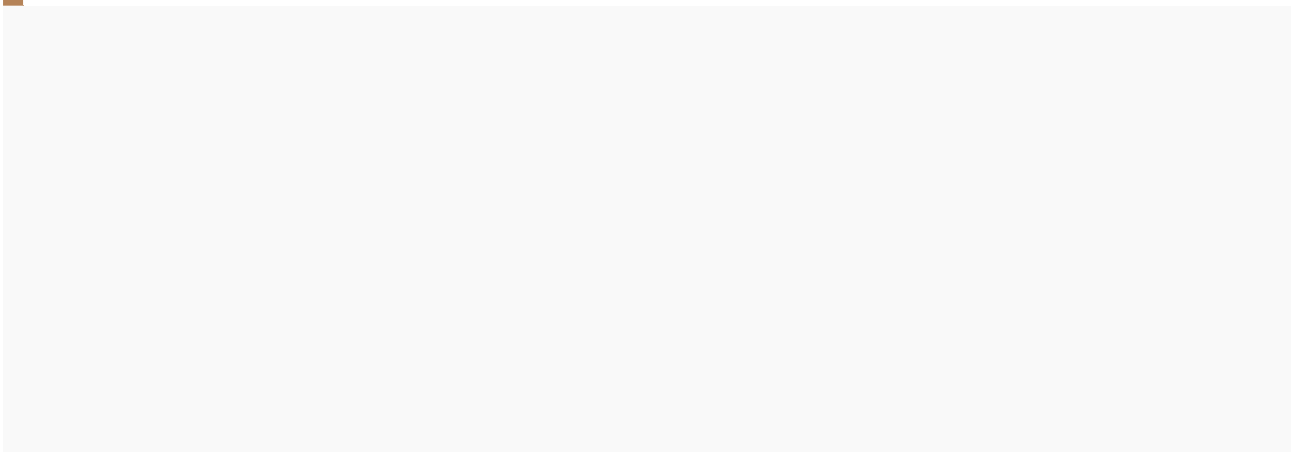
This month's topic is: Promoting database selection and use in reference interactions
